This document contains key information you should know about the Series D securities of Canoe Premium Yield Fund (formerly Canoe Premium Income Fund) (the "Fund"). Before you invest in any fund, consider how the Fund would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

On June 10, 2024, securityholders of the Fund approved the Fund's new investment objective by way of a securityholder meeting. Effective June 20, 2024, the Fund adopted its new investment objective, new investment strategies, and was renamed Canoe Premium Yield Fund. The investment holdings, asset allocation, management expense ratio and trading expense ratio displayed below reflect the results of Canoe Premium Income Fund.

What does this fund invest in?

The Fund aims to generate income and long-term capital growth by primarily writing put options, investing in equity securities, and/or writing call options on these equities. The charts below give you a snapshot of the Fund's investments on May 10, 2024. The Fund's investments will change.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

Canoe Financial has rated the volatility of this Fund as **Low to medium**. This rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

How has the fund performed?


This section shows how Series D securities of the Fund have performed over the past 4 calendar years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

The Fund changed its investment objective effective June 20, 2024. The performance of the Fund for the periods set out below may have been different had the investment objective change been in effect throughout the performance measurement period.

YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS

This chart shows how Series D securities of the Fund performed in each of the past 4 calendar years. This series of the Fund dropped in value in 1 of the 4 years.

The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



BEST and WORST 3-MONTH RETURNS

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series D securities of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 4 calendar years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

AVERAGE RETURN

The annual compounded return of this series of the Fund was 6.91% since inception. If you had invested \$1,000 in this series of the Fund when it was created, your investment would be worth \$1,410.50 as at April 30, 2024.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- are investing for the medium to long-term
- are seeking a steady flow of income and modest capital growth
- have a low to medium tolerance for risk

Do not invest in the fund unless you are willing to accept the potential loss of a portion of your investment, or if you have a short-term investment horizon.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a Fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account. Keep in mind that if you hold your Fund in a non-registered account, Fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How much does it cost?

The following tables outline the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series D securities of the Fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds, series and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales Charges

There are no sales charges for the purchase of Series D securities of the Fund.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns. As of December 31, 2023, the Series' expenses were 1.92% of its value. This equals \$19.20 for every \$1,000 invested.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and/or advice that your representative and/or their firm provide to you. Canoe Financial pays a trailing commission to your firm on Series D securities of the Fund only if they were acquired through Frontier Capital Funds Inc. The trailing commission is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate of commission is 0.25% of the value of your investments each year. This equals \$2.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	You may be charged 2% of the current value of the securities, if you redeem or switch them within 30 days of purchase. The fee is paid to the Fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under the securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document; or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
